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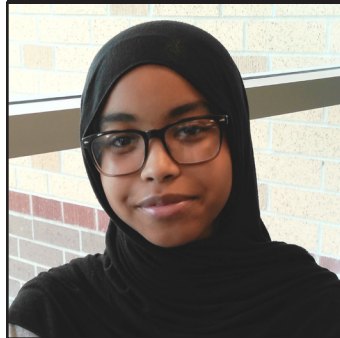
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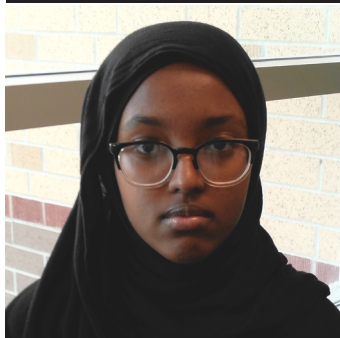
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# letter from the editor

Spring means summer is on the way and school is almost coming to an end and our articles for the 2025-2026 school year too.

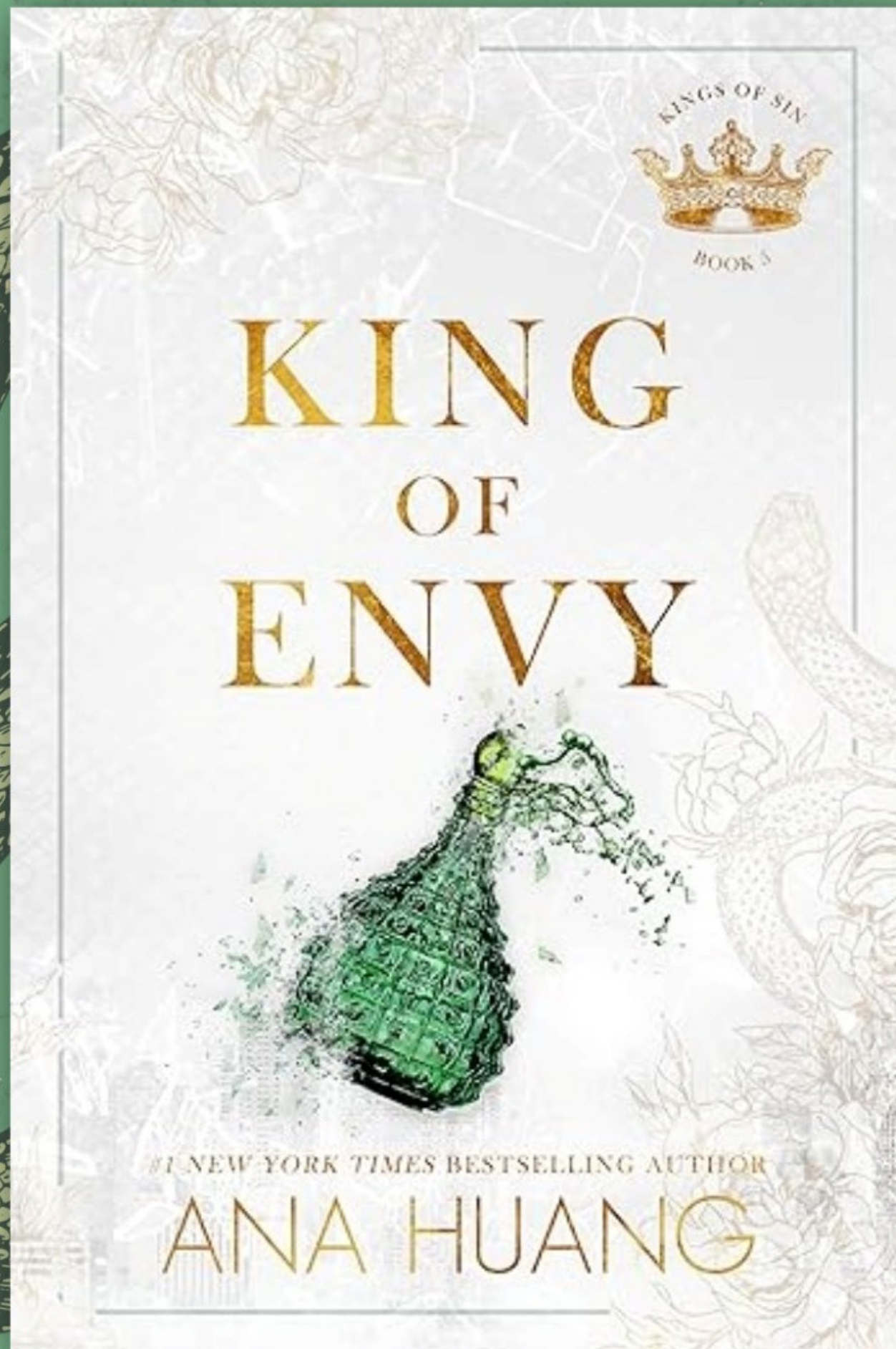
This article is filled with many different interests like diving deeper into books, debate and speech, and entertainments around the world.

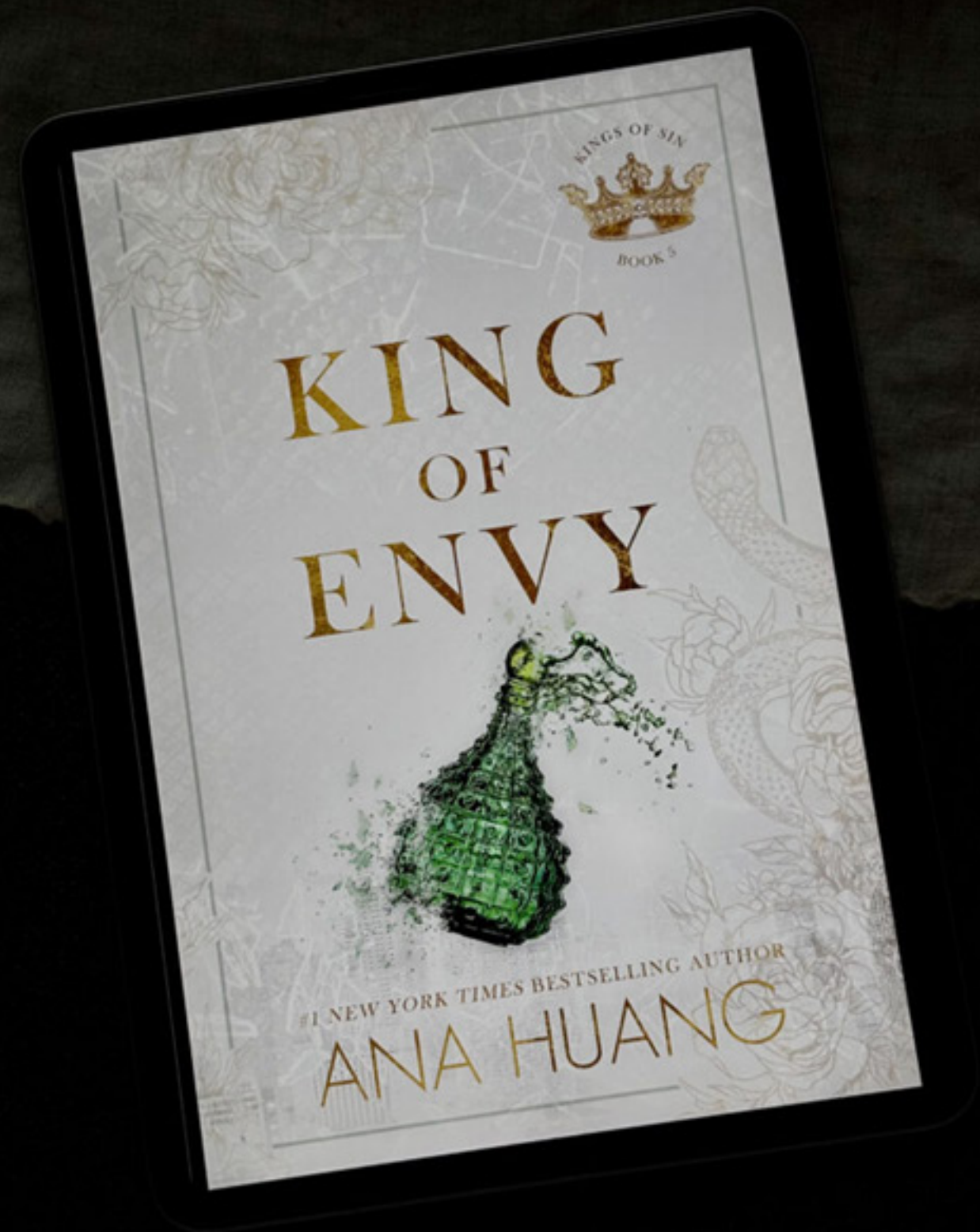
Several weeks apart and Vuk nearly lost his job, went to jail, and spent a fortune on things trying to distract

In part one, I looked over Crossfade's first two albums, and how the second strayed somewhat heavily away from what made me fall in love with the band. It would seem that I wasn't the only one disillusioned with the band's second album, *Falling Away*.

After the bombshell success of the first, platinuming with over a million records sold; the disappointing sales figures of the second, only selling about 200,000 copies, caused Columbia Records to drop Crossfade.

Lead singer Ed Sloan said he found himself in a depression, a darker place that seems to have helped his artistic intent. He felt abandoned in a way, after being on top of the world with their first album.

“Coming off the success of the first record and our way after the second album hit me hard [. . .] music had always been my escape, but then music became my enemy. I shut down as a songwriter and, actually, pretty much as a human being,” Isthmus reported.

They released We All Bleed independently, which meant no message to push or deadlines to rush for, and you can feel it right away in the composition of the first track. Each song is more willing to let

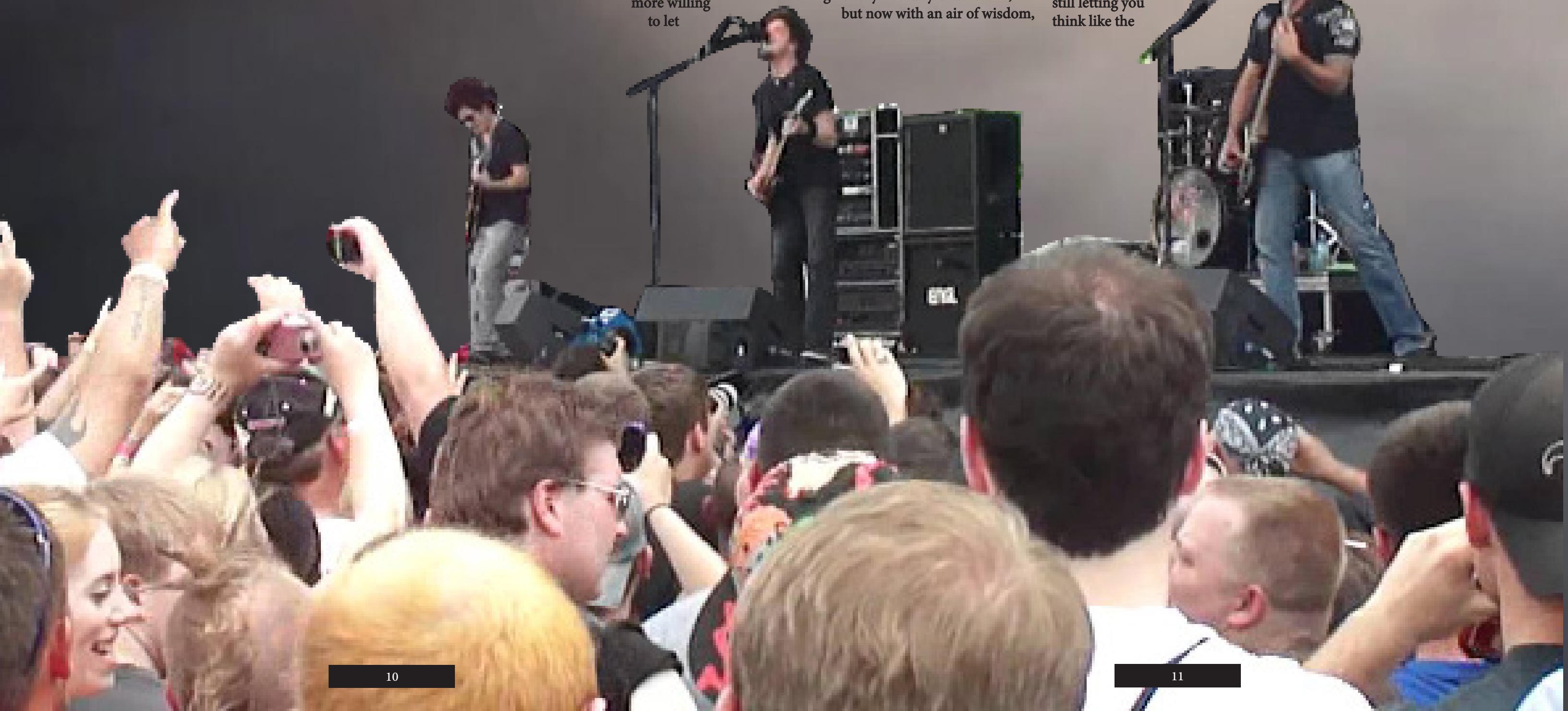
the listener create an interpretation and spiral into themselves thinking about what was just sung. The bigger spaces between the singing parts also adds to this small but present feeling of superiority, it takes you back to the first album’s strives’ for more. It also makes the band feel more comfortable with their instruments, they don’t need to sing all the time for it to sound good, and that’s great. But this time around the conflict isn’t always as easy to nail down. It’s still a man struggling to find or become something he may not fully understand, but now with an air of wisdom,

the burns of old failures are very palpable in some of the songs.

We All Bleed moves on from the girl of the second album and roughs the finely cut edges of the first to create something that is still trucking along even after all the self-medicating and personal pity parties. In less metaphorical terms, there aren’t any tracks I’d skip on repeat listenings. There’s stuff more articulate, angrier, and energizing than the first, while still letting you think like the

second allowed, without the relatively boring and same-y pitfalls the second fell into. The sound mixing of Les Hall is unbelievably good at times, I recommend listening to this album with a proper sound system if you can. And Ed definitely upped his shredding game, it makes you feel heavenly sometimes, like in Suffocate.

Like others have said, it wasn’t going to be the album to change the face of music, but it was more than worth what it was trying to be.

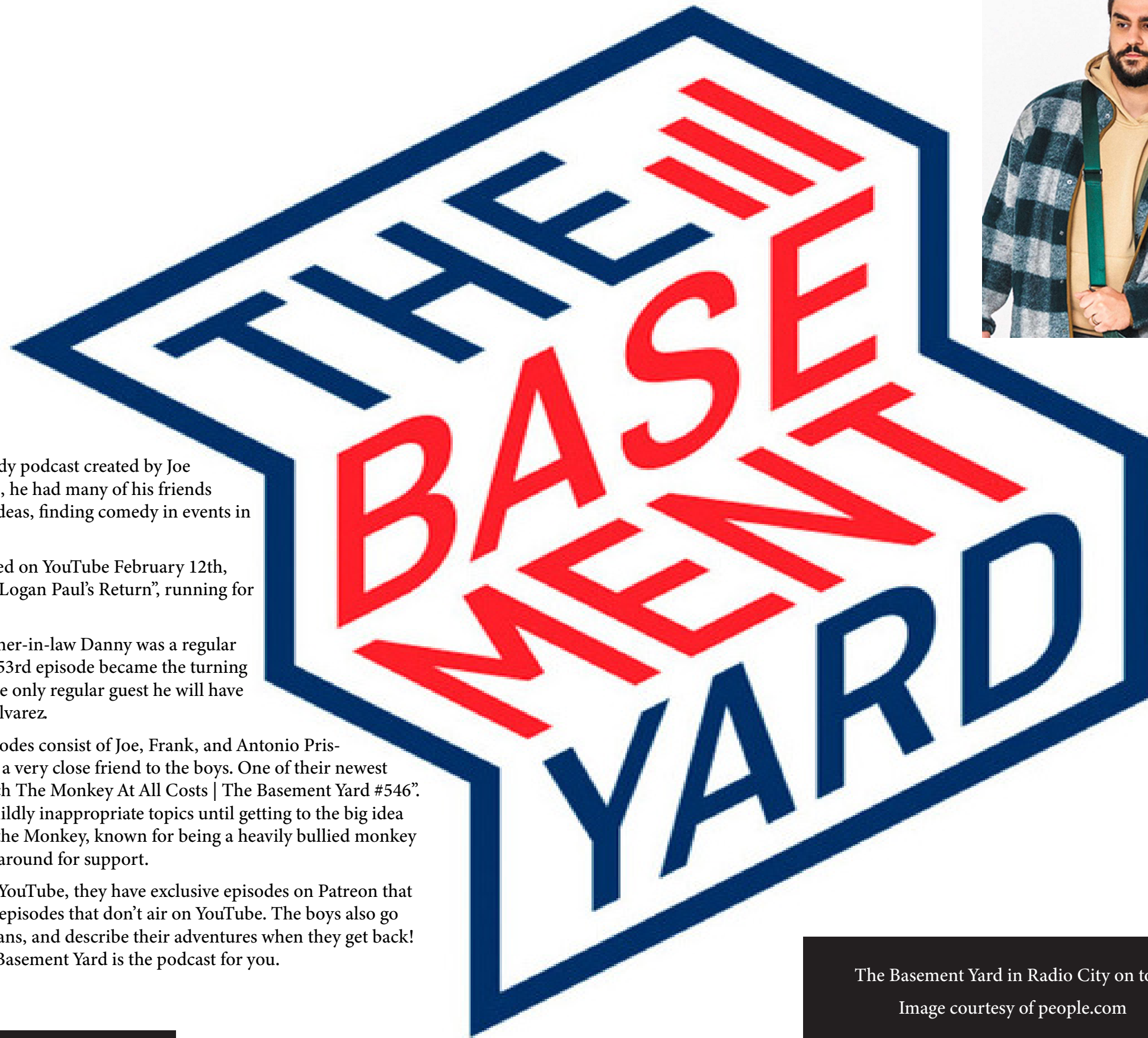

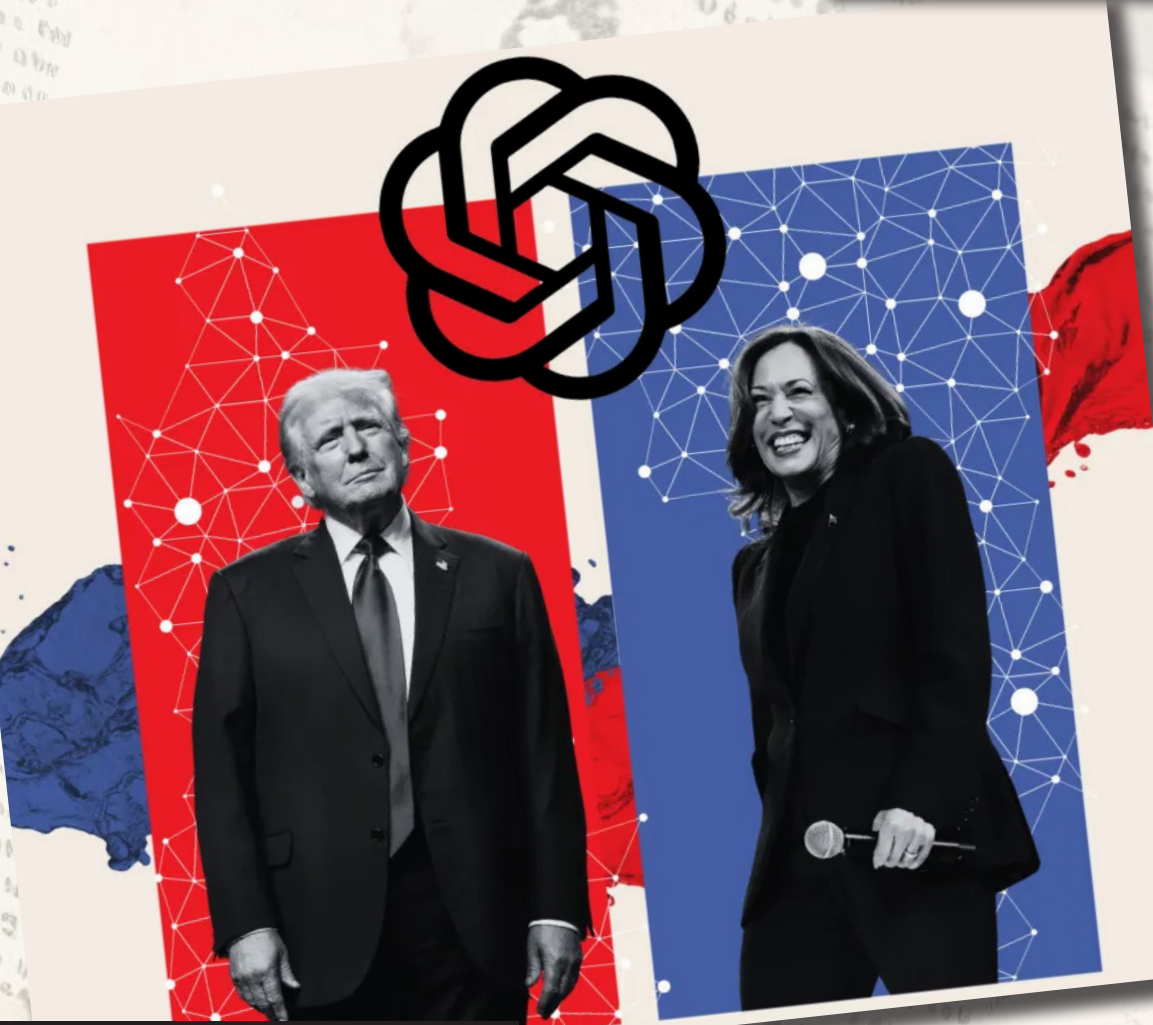
# Speech and Debate in a World of AI

AI recycles what information's already been given to it. Ask an AI to write an essay, and it will. Ask it to make an article for your journalism class, and it probably could do it in a few minutes. Ask it to take a stance, defend it under pressure, respond in real time, and persuade a skeptical audience? That's where things start to fall apart.

In a world filled with artificial intelligence, students are competing with machines that can produce faster, summarize better, and generate forever. It's even being used in presidential debates. So, the question isn't how students can keep up. It's how they can stand out. The answer might be simpler than you'd think, by trying speech and debate.

Debate teaches something AI fundamentally doesn't have. It forces students to think on their feet, adapt when their arguments are challenged, and study ideas they don't agree with. You either understand your argument, or you don't.

At West Fargo Sheyenne High School's Debate Team, that idea is proven with their success. Over the past several years, the team has steadily climbed the state rankings: 8th in 2018, 5th in 2019 and 2020, 4th in 2021, and a major leap to 2nd place and state runner-up in 2022, followed by 3rd in 2023. That kind of consistency doesn't come from copy pasting speeches generated by AI. It comes from students learning how to think, adapt, and perform under pressure.

The same pattern shows up in speech. Sheyenne has repeatedly earned national recognition through the National Speech & Debate Association's merit system, joining the prestigious 100 Club in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020, 2021, and 2023, and reaching the even rarer 200 Club in 2019 and 2022. Those milestones show the teams discipline, communication, and a commitment to mastering skills that no chatbot could ever replicate.

There's a human element that even I overlooked at one point. A well-crafted argument means nothing if it can't connect with an audience. Students in debate learn to weigh evidence, recognize bias, and make decisions in real time. Ironically, the rise of AI makes debate more relevant. The easier it becomes to generate answers, the more valuable it is to question them. Students don't need to out compute machines. They need to do what machines can't. They need to think, adapt, and argue. And that starts with debate.

Mods transform Terraria from an already expansive sandbox into something that feels almost limitless, adding new content, mechanics, and ways to play that go far beyond the base game. For many players, modded Terraria isn’t just an extension of the original—it becomes a completely different adventure.

At its core, tModLoader is a framework that allows players to easily install and manage mods without needing to alter the game manually. This accessibility is one of the biggest reasons modding has become so popular. With just a few clicks, players can load dozens of mods at once, each contributing something unique. Some mods are small quality-of-life improvements, while others are massive expansions that rival or even surpass the base game in scale.

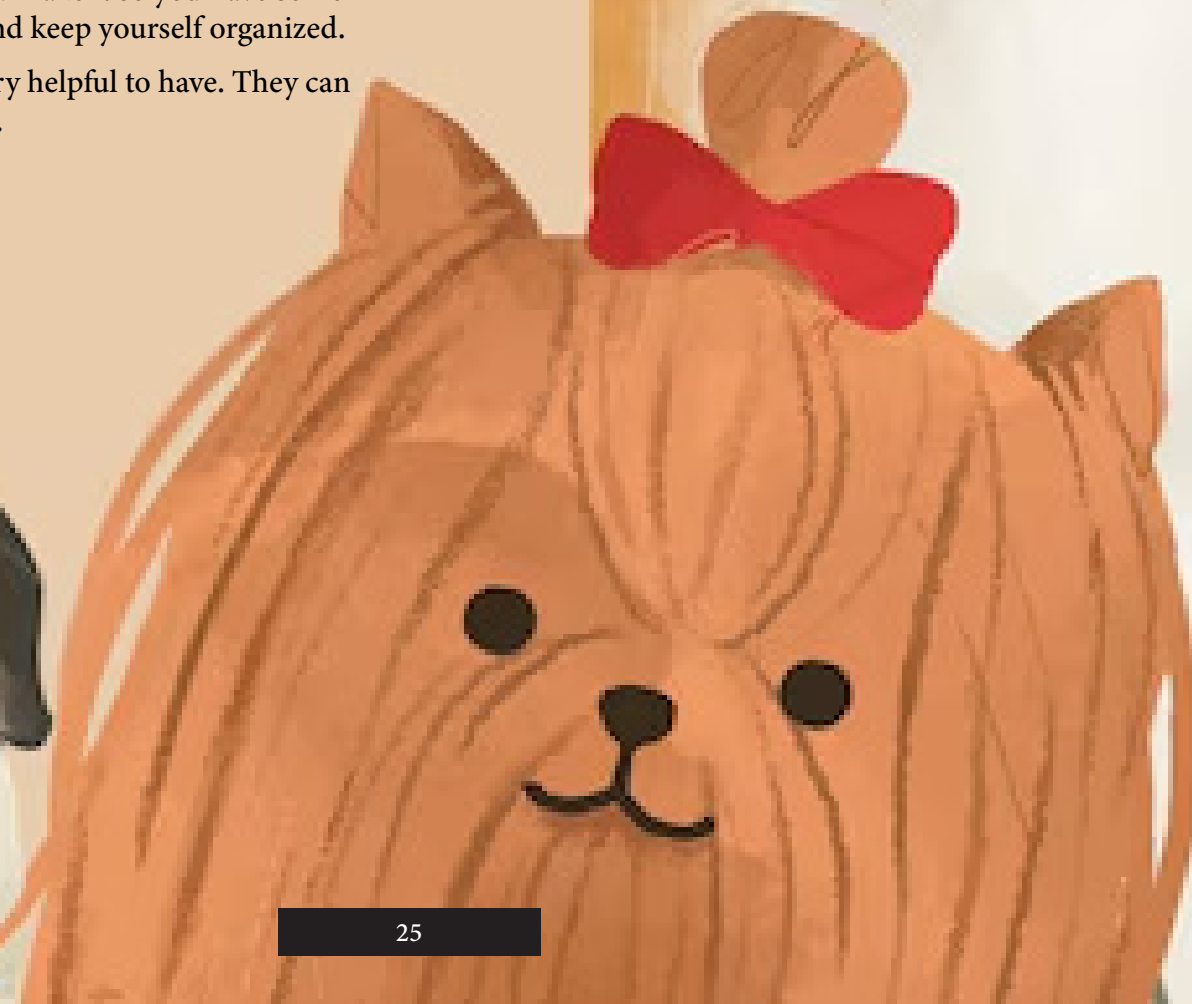
This can also help reduce stress because exercise helps you release stress.

The Neighbourhood is an incredibly popular band with over 40 million monthly listeners on Spotify, and their most streamed song 'Sweater Weather' has a little over 2.1 billion streams! To put these numbers into perspective, Mozart, the child prodigy who revolutionized western music in the 1700s, only has 7.6 million monthly streams on Spotify.

Part of the reason *The Neighbourhood* is so popular is due to their eccentric combination of hip-hop beats with indie rock guitars to create pop music with a unique "dark" twist to their music. They are especially beloved by the younger generation, and although their fanbase is a diverse group, they are predominantly females ages ranging between 13–25.

Behind their success in the music industry is the individual band members who made it happen. First, we have their vocalist Jesse Rutherford, then the guitarists Zachery Abels and Jeremiah Freedman, the bassist Micheal Margott, and finally we have the original drummer Bryan Sammis, who Brandon Fried later replaced.

All the members considered themselves to be co-founders of the band, as most of them met through the local music scene in Newbury Park, California and bonded because of it. Eventually, the group decided to merge their talents to create the iconic sound we recognize them by today.

They started out recording in Bryan Samis's parents' garage and then released their first singles such as *Sweater Weather* and *Female Robbery* in 2012. Then, in 2013 they started recording through Columbia records and released their first album titled *I Love You* in April. The album was almost an immediate success, and peaked at #14 on the billboard 100 chart, while also including two double platinum hit singles.

Although it was a commercial success, some critics claimed it was 'too dreary' and the album had a mixed response from the public. Despite the mixed critical reception of their early work, The Neighbourhood proved that audience connection can outweigh initial skepticism.

Their ability to blend genres and create a distinct emotional atmosphere has allowed them to remain relevant in an ever-changing music industry. Songs like *Sweater Weather* continue to resonate with listeners years after their release, solidifying their place in modern pop culture.

They have released more albums and singles since then, while still following their unique style of music, and are currently on a completely sold-out world tour. # Seals... The Puppies of The Sea

Known as the puppy of the sea, seals are adorable creatures that live on land and in water. They move with grace in the water while they flop on their stomachs when on land.

There are over 33 species of seals on earth, such as Harbour seals, Harp seals, Leopard seals, Gray seals, and Northern/Southern Elephant seals.

The most dangerous seal of them all is the Leopard seal, the apex predator can grow up to 12 feet and weigh over 1,200 pounds. They live in Antarctica and hunt down penguins and other seals. They are known for their aggressive behavior, razor-sharp teeth, and predatory nature, they can also swim up to 25mph.

Elephant seals, specifically Southern Elephant seals are the largest known species of seal in the world. With males reaching up to 20 feet and weighing over 8,800 pounds. They are incredible deep divers, using their sensitive whiskers to hunt in deep, dark southern oceans. They are characterized by their large trunk-like snout which they use for roaring during breeding season.

Northern Elephant seals are a little smaller than Southern Elephant seals, weighing around 3,300-5,100 pounds and measuring up to 16ft. They live in the eastern Pacific Ocean and spend most of their time in the sea.

Harp seals are very social animals and are not usually aggressive. They measure about 5-6.7ft and weigh around 250-310 pounds. Baby Harp seals are cute little white fur balls that stay on land while their mother hunts for them. As the pups get older they shed their fluffy white layer of fur and it grows in a grayer color as the age.

Harbour seals are coastal marine mammals found in temperate, sub-arctic, and arctic waters. They measure around 5-6ft and weigh around 180-300 pounds. They are fast and graceful in the water and can dive over 1,500 feet. They can also hold their breath for up to 40 minutes.

Grey seals are found in the North Atlantic, they are around 2-3 meters long and weigh around 200-400kg. Their diet consists of eels, cod, flatfish, and crustaceans. Their pups are very vocal, making sounds that can sound like a human baby crying to locate mothers.

Whether they are playfully navigating coastal waters or resting on rocks on a sunny beach, seals are adorable in their own ways. They are more than just a part of the food chain; they are resilient inhabitants of our world.

This mix of excitement and safety keeps people returning to new documentaries, podcasts, and cases.

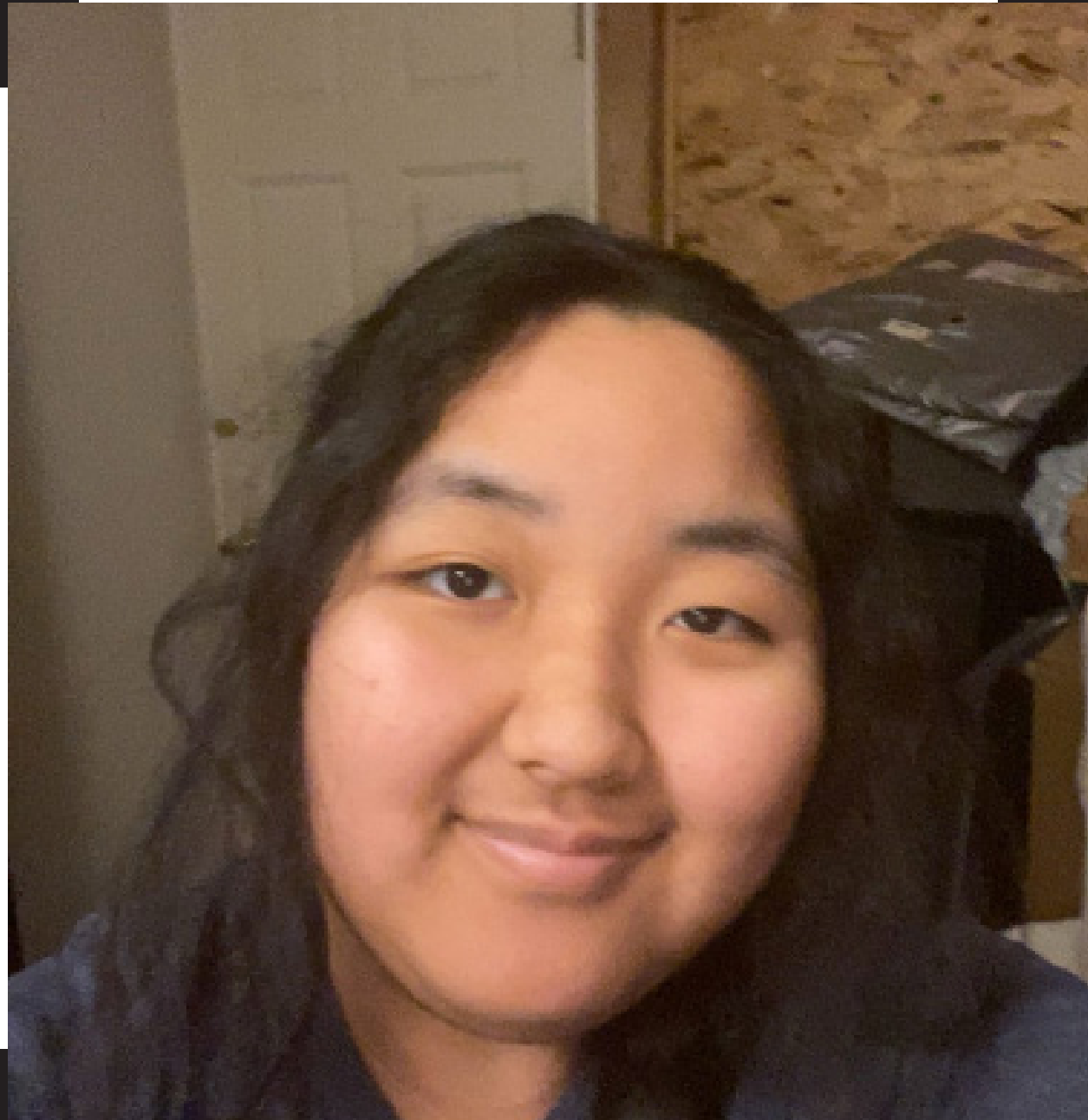
True crime helps people explore motives and empathize with victims. Unsolved cases encourage critical thinking, helping viewers make sense of confusing or frightening events.
